INTRODUCTION TO MOUNTAINBOARDING



WHAT IS MOUNTAINBOARDING?

ORIGINS AND EVOLUTION: THE RISE OF MOUNTAINBOARDING

Born in the 1990s in the United States, mountainboarding is an outdoor discipline that involves descending slopes using a specially designed all-terrain board. Blending elements of snowboarding, skateboarding, and mountain biking, this sport provides a unique experience for outdoor enthusiasts. It was initially **conceived to allow snowboarders to pursue their sport outside of the winter season.**

Practiced on mountains with varied and technical slopes, mountainboarding can also be explored on more urban surfaces such as asphalt or in skateparks, and even on sand.

With variations such as downhill mountainboarding, freeriding, and freestyle, riders can perform a wide range of tricks and maneuvers, making this sport so spectacular.

DIVERSITY AND PROGRESSION: MOUNTAINBOARDING ACCESSIBLE TO ALL

This diversity allows everyone to find an environment suited to their preferences and **skill level**, while also providing the opportunity **to push their limits** and **progress in their practice.**

Ski slopes transform into Mountainboard tracks in the summer **without the need for additional adjustments**, providing enthusiasts of this sport with an extra opportunity to enjoy mountainous terrain.

Thanks to the diversity of terrains on which it can be practiced, from the sandy beaches to the rugged mountain trails, including specially designed off-road parks, Mountainboarding offers a **unique and varied experience** to every rider. Here are some landscapes and terrains suitable for Mountainboarding.



MOUNTAIN TRAILS:

Mountain trails offer a variety of terrains, including forest paths and steep trails. Practitioners can enjoy fast descents, tight turns, and natural jumps.



OFF-ROAD PARKS:

Some parks dedicated to Mountainboarding offer specially designed tracks with obstacles, ramps, and technical descents to challenge riders of all levels.



BEACHES:

The vast expanses of sand provide an ideal terrain for Mountainboarding, allowing riders to glide along the dunes and experience a sense of freedom.



URBAN PARKS:

Some urban parks have designated areas for skateboarding and rollerblading, which can also be adapted for Mountainboarding. Riders can utilize ramps, rails, and obstacles to enhance their skills and style.

Wide open spaces provide riders with the opportunity to practice Mountainboarding without major obstacles, making it an ideal terrain for beginners or those who simply want to enjoy a relaxed ride.

AT THE FOREFRONT OF INNOVATION

CONSTANT EVOLUTION OF MOUNTAINBOARDING

In this constant quest for **adrenaline** and **exploration**, enthusiasts of this **outdoor sport** are continuously seeking **new equipment and technologies** to enhance their performance and push their limits. Advances in the design of these equipment offer improved **stability, responsiveness, and durability**, enabling riders to venture into more challenging terrains and execute bolder maneuvers with confidence.

PERFORMANCE

These days, equipment has reached unprecedented levels of performance and sophistication. Particularly noteworthy is the flexibility of the boards, whether they are made of traditional wood or composite materials. The construction techniques employed resemble those of snowboards, while a variety of trucks are available. This diversity allows for the customization of each component (tires, rims, bearings, bushings) to meet the specific requirements of each practitioner.

BOARD:



Generally **wider and sturdier** than a standard board, with a construction of wood or composite materials **to withstand impacts** and challenging conditions.



TRUCKS :

The trucks, the axles on which the wheels are mounted, are reinforced **to provide better stability and maneuverability on varied terrains**. Some models may have suspension trucks **to absorb shocks**.



WHEELS:

The wheels are larger and wider than those of traditional boards, often pneumatic for **better grip** and shock absorption on rough terrain.



SAFETY:

Riders **consistently** wear protective gear such as helmets, **knee pads**, and **elbow pads** to safeguard themselves in case of a fall.

BRAKES:

Some models can be equipped with brakes to help slow down or stop the board when necessary, although their presence is not universal.

ACCESSOIRES :

Some mountainboards can be equipped with accessories such as handles for transport or **lights for night riding**.

BINDINGS:

Bindings similar to those used in snowboarding can be employed **to secure the rider's feet** in place during the ride.



WHY DO OUTDOOR SPORTS ATTRACT SO MUCH ATTENTION?

UNITED BY SPORT: PUSHING BOUNDARIES AND BUILDING BONDS

Action sports provide an outlet, **helping to overcome fears, maintain self-control, and manage uncertainty.** How does sports bring people together? By uniting individuals from different backgrounds around a common goal, fostering **the creation of bonds**, and highlighting their similarities.

President of the Auvergne Mountainboard School

DEVELOPING MOUNTAINBOARDING IN AUVERGNE

Gabin Dupont, from Wesford School in Clermont-Ferrand, interviews Vincent Lavaud, president of the Auvergne Mountainboarding School. Vincent shares his sporting journey, his commitment, and his desire to promote the discipline.

Could you tell us about what motivated you to get involved in Mountainboarding?

I discovered this sport in Auvergne, more precisely at Super Lioran, during a demonstration organized by the resort in 2001. Since then, I haven't let go of this sport. It was quite accessible, affordable, and above all, didn't require any ski lifts.

You could move around on foot almost anywhere, which is the freedom of this sport. From a more personal perspective, what also encouraged my involvement in this discipline is how easily it blends with outdoor activities like walking the dog.

Is it the sense of freedom that characterizes mountainboarding?

Yes, that's right, which somewhat parallels skateboarding. In the early days of skateboarding in the 70s-80s, and later when it arrived in France, what motivated people was the ability to do it wherever and whenever they wanted. Mountainboarding is somewhat the same. It's a sport that is still in development and offers that same freedom and creativity.



Alright. What are your goals for the mountainboarding school as president?

I don't really have personal goals as a president. My goals are more related to the development of the association. Personally, I find satisfaction in working on the development of this sport, even though being involved in an association can sometimes be a constraint.

Many people eager to develop this sport in Auvergne mobilized for the World Championships (in July 2023, Editor's note) at both the local and national levels, and I thank them for that.

How does the association organize itself to achieve its goals?



For now, we are in the process of creating the school. We established the first association, Volcanic Mountainboard, to kick-start our efforts. Then, we organized the World Championships in Super-Besse in a more professional manner, with greater human and financial resources. Now, we are working on setting up the school, seeking solid contacts for the first few years, which will be challenging in terms of budget and investments.

How do you collaborate with other organizations or entities to promote mountainboarding and its values?

We work with several local partners to promote Mountainboarding. We strive to be professional in our approach, highlighting the sport's vision regarding tourism, territorial development, and entertainment.

We collaborate with local stakeholders such as Super-Besse, local breweries like La Banne, local textile brands like Sancy Backcountry, as well as local action sports associations. We try to establish strong partnerships to enhance the visibility of Mountainboarding in our region.

Do you consider mountainboarding to be environmentally friendly, then?

Indeed, by its very nature, Mountainboarding is environmentally friendly. The practice of this sport often involves hiking uphill without using ski lifts, and we avoid heavy modifications to the terrain as much as possible. Our vision regarding environmental preservation is shared by many resorts and stakeholders in outdoor recreation.

What do you see as your role in the opening of the mountainboarding school, and what are your aspirations for its long-term development?

My role has been to catalyze this momentum and drive a project to showcase our region through Mountainboarding. We hosted numerous participants from around the world during the World Championships at Super-Besse last year, which has

contributed to showcasing our region. In the long term, we aspire to reach a local audience and democratize the practice of Mountainboarding by offering accessible classes and initiations to everyone.

What were the main lessons learned from organizing last year's international championship, and how have they been applied to strengthen the association's and the sport's position in the community?

The organization of the International Championship allowed us to connect with numerous stakeholders in various fields and learn a lot about managing an event of this scale. We have used these lessons to professionalize our approach and enhance the credibility of Mountainboarding as a serious sport. We are now striving to maintain this credibility and continue progressing step by step.


How do you plan to increase the visibility of the school?

We have several initiatives underway to increase the visibility of the school. We are revamping our website and will launch it soon. We will also utilize communication materials such as brochures and business cards, as well as social media platforms like Instagram and Facebook.

We are also collaborating with local partners and the press to promote the school. Finally, we plan to invite schools and tourism providers to visit the school and offer Mountainboarding initiations.



Our association comprises nine dedicated members, each bringing their passion and expertise to advance our common mission. Among these members, we are privileged to have two remarkable individuals known for their achievements and unwavering commitment.



DIEGO ANDERSON AND THE BIRTH OF THE FRENCH MOUNTAINBOARD ASSOCIATION (AMTB)

Diego Anderson, an iconic figure in Mountainboarding, played a central role in the creation of the French Mountainboard Association (AMTB). Driven by an unwavering passion for the sport, Anderson brought together a **small group of riders who shared his vision in 2001**. Together, they laid the foundations of the AMTB, which has become a **major player** in the Mountainboarding scene in France.

2

EXPANSION AND PROFESSIONALIZATION: THE EVOLUTION OF THE IMA

Over the years, Diego Anderson's commitment to the Mountainboard community **has extended beyond national borders**. He played a crucial role in the transition to a more **professional approach to the sport**. This evolution led to the establishment of the International Mountainboard Association (IMA) in 2009, marking a significant milestone in **the regulation and promotion of Mountainboarding on a global scale**.

PASSING THE TORCH: DAVE STIEFVATER AND KODY STEWART

After years of dedication to the IMA, Diego Anderson chose to pass the torch. In 2016, **Dave Stiefvater was elected president of the IMA**, continuing the work initiated by Anderson to advance the sport. Then, in 2018, **Kody Stewart took the helm**, bringing his own vision and energy to the presidency of the IMA, alongside leaders such as Matt Brind and Mikael Gramont.

THE RISE OF THE AMTB: AN EXPANDING NETWORK

Thanks to the impetus provided by Diego Anderson, the AMTB quickly evolved into a network of Mountainboard clubs across France, thus becoming a major force in promoting the sport. Despite its transformation into EMF and its affiliation with the FFRS, **the initial commitment to Mountainboard accessibility persists through active local clubs** such as those in Monistrol-sur-Loire, Les Saisies, and Toulouse.

COMMITMENT AND ACCESSIBILITY: THE AMTB'S CREDO

Figures like Ludovic Faure from AMC Compiègne, Quentin Flecher and Antoine Gambier at Naranorider in Brittany, as well as HxC MTB in Saint-Martin-de-Laye under the leadership of Gregory Barbier, have continued **to energize the mountainboarding community by organizing events and developing infrastructures.** Meanwhile, the Loire Atlantique Mountainboard association, led by Mael Baudoin, maintains an active presence with an ecological park and strong partnerships, **thus contributing to the growth of the sport at both local and institutional levels.**

This story, initiated by Diego Anderson and the AMTB, illustrates **the importance of individual and collective commitment in the development of a passionate and dynamic community of Mountainboard riders.** Their dedication catalyzed a **major evolution** in the world of Mountainboarding, not only **in France** but also on a **global scale.** The **HxC MTB club** in Saint-Martin-de-Laye (33), under the leadership of Grégory Barbier, has also played a crucial role in the sport's development **by organizing French championships** and providing training and education.



ADMINISTRATIVE MEMBERS

The IMA is on the verge of entering a new era with **ongoing elections** that will lead to the integration of new members into the association. The results of these elections are expected by **May 16th**. Currently, the members of the administration include Mikael Gramont, Matt Brind, and Kody Stewart, each bringing valuable expertise in the field of Mountainboarding.


MOUNTAINBOARDING: FUSION OF ADRENALINE AND FREEDOM ON THE TRAILS

The MountainBoard WMC, also known as the **World Mountainboard Championships**, represents the pinnacle of international competition in the field of Mountainboarding. This competition brings together passionate practitioners of this outdoor sport, challenging them through a **variety of events**, ranging from downhill to slalom to freestyle.

THE 2023 MOUNTAINBOARD WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS: THRILLS AND DOWNHILL AT SUPER-BESSE

Held in the mountainous region of **Sancy**, the Mountain Board WMC highlights the most skilled riders and provides a platform for everyone to experience their skills and passion.

The Mountainboard Downhill World Championships took place from **July 17 to 18, 2023, in Super-Besse, Auvergne, closing out a week of competition in France**, which also included Freestyle and Boardercross events in Venette, Oise.

REVIEW OF THE 2023 MOUNTAINBOARD CHAMPIONSHIP PROCEEDINGS

THE START OF THE 2023 MOUNTAINBOARD CHAMPIONSHIP

Super-Besse was the center of global attention on July 17th and 18th, 2023, during the Mountainboard Championship. The first day was marked by **the qualification phase on the Hermines track**, where competitors from around the world showcased their skill and technique from 1:30 PM to 7:00 PM. Meanwhile, spectators were captivated by the numerous Freestyle animations that enlivened the venue from 2:00 PM to 7:00 PM.

Mountainboarding **initiation sessions** were also offered, **allowing beginners to learn the basics of the sport**. The event booth allowed participants and visitors to explore various activities and products related to Mountainboarding. The day concluded with a **meet-and-greet between the audience and the competitors**, fostering exchanges and sharing experiences on **an international scale**.

CRESCENDO: CHAMPIONSHIP FINAL AND CLOSING CEREMONY

JUNIOR WORLD CHAMPION OF THE WMC

Simon Veyssières, from the Wesford Clermont-Ferrand school, interviews a young enthusiast of Mountainboarding who won the junior competition at the WMC. Through this discussion, the young champion shares his journey in this sport, from his beginnings at the age of 11 to his recent successes. They also explore the challenges and highlights of his practice, highlighting the community spirit and international openness that Mountainboarding offers to its followers.

How old were you during the competition and where are you from?

I'm 17 years old, and I was also 17 during the competition. I come from Rouans, a commune near Nantes. For the past 6 years, I've been practicing Mountainboarding every weekend at the Loire-Atlantique MountainBoard club. The association has been around since I was 15, and the terrain has been around for 7 years.

Do you still practice in the same place?

We usually go to the Loire-Atlantique Mountainboard terrain, and sometimes we head to the skatepark in Nantes whenever we have some free time.

What are the main competition events in Mountainboarding? What titles have you won so far and in which categories?

Can you explain the different competition categories in Mountain Boarding and which one will you compete in this year?

The pro category works as follows: everyone can participate in a pro qualification, then the top 10 from the qualification compete for the title of best pro. If you finish 11th or 12th, you go back to the open or junior categories depending on your age.

There are the French and World Championships every year. The French Championship will take place in Nantes this year, on June 28th and 29th. I was the vice-champion of France in 2021 and 2022, and the world champion in 2023. Those are about the only titles I have, always in the junior category.

This year, I'm moving up to the open level, in the junior category (13 to 17 years old). The open category is for 18 to 35-year-olds, and the master category is for those 35 years and older.

What initially drew you to Mountain Boarding compared to other sports?

I discovered this sport because the terrain my club built is really just 200 meters from my house. I was really drawn to the sensations it provides. I used to play football and judo when I was younger, but I didn't like the spirit they conveyed. Mountain Boarding conveys a different spirit.

How would you describe the atmosphere at Mountainboard competitions, especially between different regions?

In Auvergne, we were only 2 registered in the junior category, but in Compiègne, we were between 10 and 12. The atmosphere was cool, it was a family spirit.

What are the main mental and physical challenges you encounter when practicing Mountainboarding?

Mentally, it's about being able to disconnect to throw yourself into 4-meter-high ramps or tackle big bumps. Physically, it's mainly about balance and coordination.

What is your most memorable moment in your Mountainboarding career so far and why?

I would say the 2023 World Championships. Being with all the foreigners who come to participate in the competition is something special. We are used to receiving Anglo-Saxons, but discovering other people practicing Mountainboarding elsewhere, in different conditions, it's quite nice to chat with them.

Can you tell us a bit about your journey in the world of Mountainboarding?

How did you start and what are the steps that have led you to where you are today?

I started when I was 13 years old with a discovery activity, similar to the one that will be offered at Sancy in August, for example. And from there, I continued practicing with enthusiasts in a club. Then, when I was able to manage on my own, I started competing in France and abroad. Little by little, I've always stayed in this sport and environment.

At 13, I joined the Bordeaux club; at 18, my first French championship in 2016; at 21, my first world championship. Since 2016, I've participated in every possible competition held in Europe, with a few exceptions. I won the last one at Sancy. I've also won other French championship titles, but I couldn't tell you the years.

What attracts you most to practicing Mountainboard? What aspects of this sport do you find unique?

The natural aspect, the friendly atmosphere, the freedom to go anywhere, on all types of terrain, having fun with freestyle and different disciplines.

What are the main challenges faced by professional Mountainboarders, whether it's on a technical, physical, or mental level?

The biggest challenge is being able to practice the sport due to a lack of infrastructure. Maintaining the terrain, keeping motivation to ride, and having people involved in the sport to join us are essential. The rest is enjoyment and athletic practice.


The equipment is quite easy, the investment is not necessarily very expensive, we keep the board for several years, and licenses are not very expensive in clubs either. It's not necessarily financial, mostly a matter of time and doing it with other people.



Has being a woman in this sports community been a challenge?


So, in the mountain board community, absolutely not. People are supportive, as in many other sports. There isn't the same progression from a male or female perspective, but in mountain boarding, there's indeed a big gap in skill level and participation, but for the practice of the sport, it doesn't make a difference.

What can you tell us about the difficulty of practicing Mountainboarding and the skills required to learn this sport?



Actually, while it does require a lot of skills, it's a sport where people can have fun very quickly without a very strong physical commitment, similar to skiing and snowboarding where people just practice for fun, which doesn't require particular physical skills. But if you want to reach a higher level, it will require significant skills in

balance, courage, the ability to take measured risks, a strong mindset, perseverance, and hard work. It's important to remember that there are several levels of practice. The idea is to bring people into this sport who will come to have fun in both summer and winter just to enjoy riding.



How do you see the evolution of Mountainboard in terms of popularity and recognition in the world of extreme sports?

There was a time of Red Bull sponsorship. In England, there was a big mountain board scene between 2000 and 2010, with an astonishing number of practitioners, car ads where mountain boarders raced against cars, a Disney movie "Camp Rock" with a mountain board training camp. There were phases of high popularity for mountainboarding.

Now it's much more intimate, people practice it especially in their corner of the forest and don't come together. The sport would be on a downward trend. With climate change, I like to call it "the sport of the apocalypse" because when there's no more snow, everyone who wants to keep riding mountains will have to switch to mountain boarding. So, we have good days ahead of us, but people don't know it yet.

It depends on the media coverage. Many people ask questions, some think they are electric vehicles. I think it will continue, whether it will continue in the direction of a federation, small competitions, or like skateboarding with mostly free practice. But there is a future for mountain boarding, and there has been a past for mountain boarding.

What message(s) would you like to convey to people hesitant about getting into this extreme sport that is Mountainboarding?

The message is clear: try it out for the enjoyment. You'll quickly experience sensations without putting yourself in danger. The goal is for it to be a pleasant experience, not necessarily putting pressure on yourself and watching all the experts performing at a high level.

Just like with horseback riding, you start with leisurely rides. Pleasure is the driving force of practice. Today, if I don't enjoy going to a competition, I don't go to the competition.

As a professional, what are your main sources of motivation and how do you stay inspired in your Mountainboarding practice?

There's a lot of content on the internet now. You can stay on top of that. There are a lot of new spaces to discover and new riders to share things with. Doing it alone all the time can be a bit boring.

What are your most memorable or rewarding moments as a professional Mountainboarder so far?

I think back to one of the first French championships I did when everyone congratulated me at the end, I really felt like I belonged to a collective. Then, I also remember a competition in England where I went alone as a self-taught rider, where I

discovered a whole new community of riders, which was really cool, where people were super welcoming. And I also think back to my victory last year at Sancy, a little moment of personal glory.

Finally, could you share with us an overview of your future projects or goals in the field of Mountainboarding?

My goal is to successfully land a 360 and then I want to start hitting rails. That's a really big goal for me. For me, it's a continuing story, I really don't plan on stopping it. And then, it's about revitalizing the Bordeaux club in terms of practice and sharing this club with other riders from around the world.

Around Bordeaux, there aren't too many usable mountains, right?

Actually, you don't need big mountains, just a bit of slope is enough. The other clubs are in Nantes and in Brittany, and as long as the terrains are arranged, it's not at all like at Sancy where it's a natural area.
